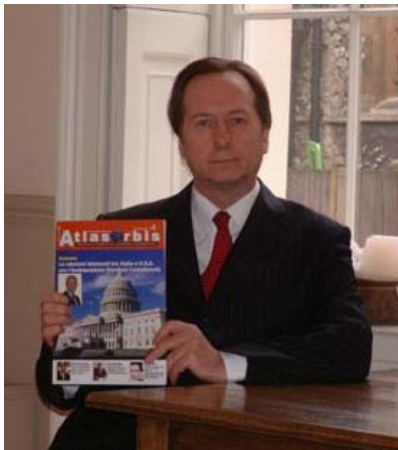

How people in London perceive sense of fear and how is the atmosphere in London after the arrests of the terrorist which wanted to blow up the civilian jets?

The atmosphere in London since the arrest of the terrorists has been very positive. However, British people are concerned that so many of the terrorists are young men born in the UK although of a foreign family origin.

What new security measures have been taken by British authorities after this arrests to defend the security of citizens in UK?

London has always has good security with the use of automatic vehicle number plate recognition and screening, extensive CCTV camera networks, suspect profiling, stop and search and good criminal intelligence. All of these have been stepped up and good progress is being made. However now other major cities within the United Kingdom are doing more to prepare for future terrorism.
